

Proclamation

WHEREAS; extreme heat and humidity create emergencies of great concern due to the potential threats to lives of the citizens of the State of Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS; summer heat waves have caused the most weather-related deaths in Wisconsin for the past 50 years, far exceeding the number of tornado and other storm-related deaths; and

WHEREAS; in 2011, there were five heat-related deaths and more than 100 heat-related injuries reported during a major heat wave that occurred throughout Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS; in 2013, 11 Wisconsin residents suffered heat-related deaths; and


WHEREAS; the citizens of the State of Wisconsin can be seriously affected by severe heat, and it is essential that we increase awareness of the dangers of heat waves and the protective actions which may be taken by citizens;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Scott Walker, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim Thursday, June 12, 2014, as

HEAT AWARENESS DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin, and I commend this observance to all of our citizens.


